STATE OF LOUISIANA NON SUBSTANTIAL ACTION PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 9

1. HUD was sent this version of the OCD-DRU Action Plan Amendment No. 9.

(Update: **8-29-2018**, the Louisiana DOA deleted the first version of the APA 9 that was sent to HUD from the states website. Download a copy of the APA 9 before the edits that take out the <u>SBA \$682 million being held for those that had SBA loans</u>.)

The State of Louisiana Office of Community Development - Disaster Recovery Unit published it's Action Plan Amendment 9 on or around July 18th 2018.

The Action plan was published to the OCD-DRU folder on the www.DOA.LA.Gov website. This is normal reporting behavior for the OCD-DRU when it comes to making action plans public. But what makes this action plan so important to the Citizens of Louisiana is the fact that the Director of the OCD-DRU Patrick Forbes agree to and stated that they were going to hold funds to assist SBA Disaster Loan recipients with the grant money that was placed on hold once HUD offered Guidance or Congress passed a Law.

What was so interesting about this Action Plan Amendment 9 post is the fact that it was changed just before a copy was sent to HUD.

Here's what changed between July 18th 2018 the morning of and before HUD received the action plan on July 19th 2018.

Original Public Post by the OCD-DRU on July 18th 2018:

"By increasing the reimbursement percentage from 50% to 100% for households eligible under Phases III VI, the state anticipates spending \$649 million on the Homeowner Program, leaving an estimated \$682 million. In the context of the different pieces of legislation going through Congress related to how to account for SBA loans as a duplication of benefit, the state may hold the balance until Congress and HUD issue updated and definitive guidance on how to treat SBA loans when calculating eligible award amounts to serve that potential unmet need."

Edited Public Post by the OCD-DRU on July 18th / 19th 2018:

"By increasing the reimbursement percentage from 50% to 100% for households eligible under Phases III VI, the state anticipates spending \$649 million on the Homeowner Program, leaving an estimated \$682 million. The state is continuing to update its unmet needs assessment and will make a determination on how to program available funding in future action plan amendments."

The State of Louisiana Office of Community Development has removed all mention of placing a hold on \$682 until Congress and HUD issue guidance.

HUD has issued it's guidance to the State OCD-DRU and they have denied the state to use funds to pay off SBA Loans.

HUD was informed by a summary email which is copied below both what was sent and what HUD replied with.

It is clear the OCD-DRU Summary omitted all communications regarding placing on Hold \$682 million.

It is typically HUD Policy to want to be informed when large numbers of millions are placed on hold to benefit select groups of people. HUD does appreciate being in the loop for these types of reports.

Hello Mr. Forbes,

The Department has received and reviewed the State of Louisiana's non-substantial Action Plan Amendment (APA) 9. It is noted that APA 9 modifies the reimbursement award structure of the Restore Louisiana Homeowner Program, and provides a technical clarification of award caps related to certain components of the Program, including mobile homes and elevation in the cases of reconstruction. For the Restore Louisiana Homeowner Program, APA 9 increases the percentage of the award for eligible homeowners in Phases III VI from 50% to 100% of the eligible award amount. The Department notes that the implementation of the this amendment will affect the State's LMI overall benefit percentage, decreasing it from 63% to 58%, based on the State's estimate. While the State is currently on target to exceed the required overall benefit threshold of 55%, HUD will continue to closely monitor the State's progress in this area.

This email serves as HUD&rsquos acknowledgement of APA 9.
